

Dangerous Prayers – Isaiah 64:1-8
LifeGroup Questions

1. One of the refrains of Isaiah 64:1-8 is “Lord would you do it again? Would you do the amazing things you did in the past?” If you could ask God to for you now, again, one thing He had done for you in the past, what would it be?

2. In our first week, the prayer was “Search me.” This week the prayer is “Break Me.” Which prayer is harder for you to pray? Why?

3. In his book on prayer, O. Hallesby called helplessness our greatest prayer. Do you agree? Why or why not? Why is it difficult to admit we need help?

4. In Isaiah 64:4, Isaiah says that the characteristic of those for whom God works...is that they are those who wait on God. Dan talked about three ways of waiting. A. When we pray, we wait on God. B. When we persevere we wait on God. C. When we are expectant as we work, we wait on God. Which type of waiting is most important for you right now? Which is the most difficult? Why?

5. In Isaiah 64:3-4, Isaiah talks about how God does awesome things beyond our expectations. In other words, He amazes us. What is something God has done that has amazed you? Think about what He has done around you, through you, and in you.

6. Isaiah 64:5-7 is a description of people who desperately need God. When do you have the deepest sense of how desperately you need God? In what way does Isaiah’s description connect with or convict you?

7. Isaiah 64:8 – You are our Father. You are the potter. We are the clay. There is truth in this verse. There is a call to surrender in this verse. But how does it specifically apply to you? How will you lean into this verse?
