

LifeGroup Discussion Questions
Life's Too Short to Settle: 2 Kings 7:1-9

1. Sometimes at Calvary we talk about having a holy discontent. A holy discontent is some issue of broken people/places that grabs your heart. Something inside you wants to rise up and fix it. What bad news in the world gives rise to a holy discontent in your life?

2. Read 2 Kings 7:3-4 – Dan said that God is drawn to hopeful desperation and in addition to the story, he referenced the Sermon the Mount. Are there other scriptures that come to your mind that support this principle?

3. Have you ever experienced hopeful desperation? What were the circumstances? How did it resolve?

4. Related again to 2 Kings 7:3-4, Dan suggested that death can actually give us hope. What do you think about that statement? How can faith in life after death change life before death?

5. In 2 Kings 7:5-8, God gives four lepers a stockpile of stuff. How do you describe your stockpile? How has God poured out grace upon your life?

6. In 2 Kings 7:9 the four men are convicted to share their stockpile with those in need. Dan talked about sharing our resources, sharing our community, sharing our story and sharing Christ. Which one of those four are hardest for you to share? Who has God put on your mind/heart as someone with whom you should share?

7. From the whole 28k series, what have you heard from God? What principles, or promises have you learned or been reminded of? Where is God calling you to lean in and apply something?
